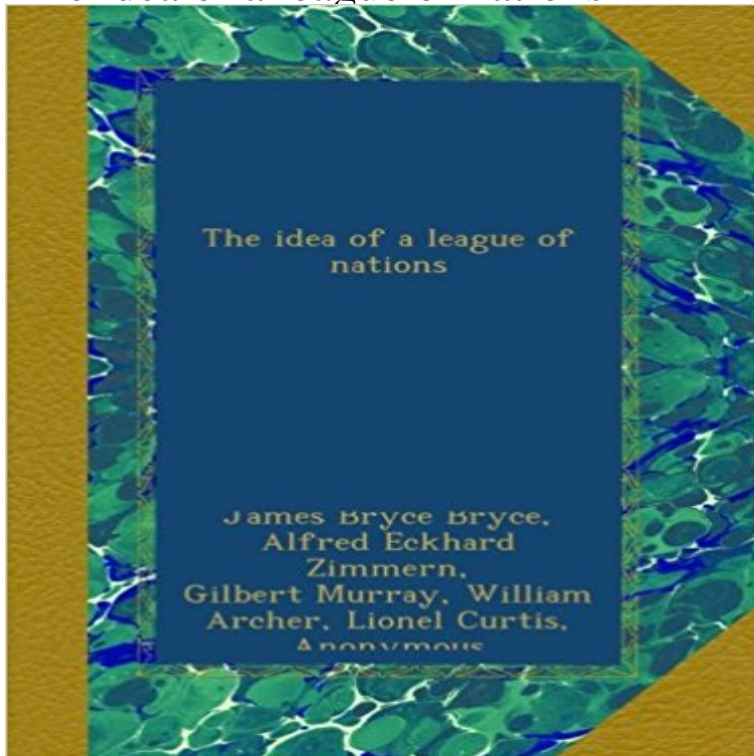


## The idea of a league of nations
