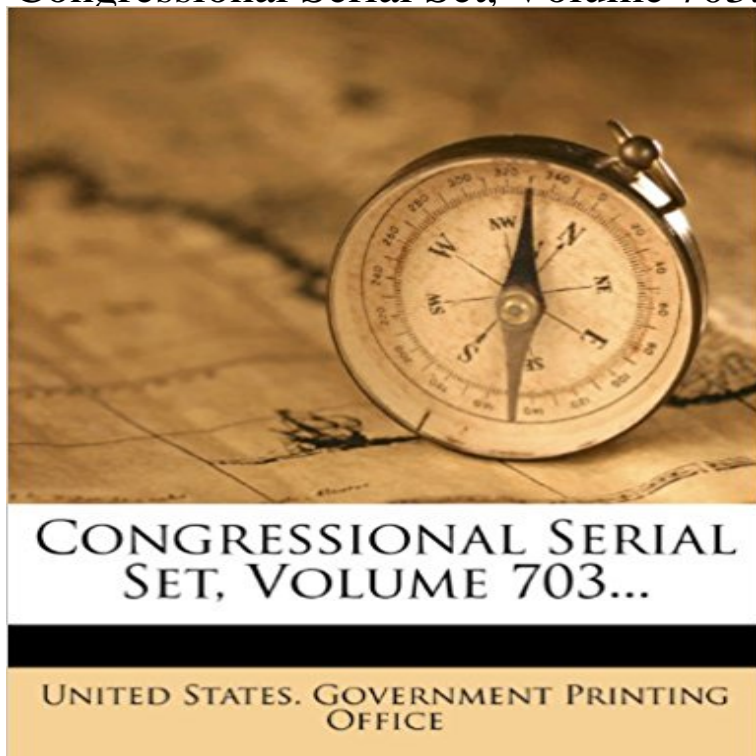


## Congressional Serial Set, Volume 703...
